Many of you will be aware – and recall – that it has been a long-time initiative of the Parish Council to be able to offer allotments to its parishioners with the initial proposed site being situated in a field and behind St Robert's church. This land is of course owned by NYC and, as such, a good portion of it is leased to a farmer and so for that reason, and others, the local authority would not support or facilitate the Parish Council's intent.

For your opinions to carry any weight we need a minimum of six positive expressions. All must be from different households and all must live within the parish so please include your name and address.

New rubbish bin!

Following our appeal to NYC in November for a bin to be placed in the locality of Sandy Banks wood – and particularly because of the increased dog litter in that area – we have been delighted by the super-speed of NYC officers in activating our request and with a new bin placed at the entrance of the wood on Church Lane. The bin was in situ within two weeks of an email being sent and for this we would like to express our thanks to NYC for this excellent service.

Parish benches

There are 20 benches within our parish of which 13 are owned by NYC and 7 by your Parish Council. We are aware that some of the NYC benches are requiring some maintenance and repair and that any remedial work on them can take some considerable time to complete. To that end, we are pleased that NYC have agreed to a "double devolution" of the 13 benches to the Parish Council but *not until* current repairs have been undertaken. Once this has been done, then your councillors will be able to regularly monitor their condition and be responsible for any ensuing work which hopefully will mean that future use will be a comfortable experience!
