Post script to Newsletter No 2

I don't want to plague parishioners with emails but we believe this latest piece of information is of significant importance. We have received several responses to my latest newsletter regarding the time frame for responses to Bellway and Forward Investment's Survey Monkey questions. We are pleased to announce that we have managed to get the deadline for answering extended to 10th March.

We can also advise that there will be a meeting with NYCC Highways, local ward councillors and parish councillors later this week to discuss the issue of access to the "Dunlopillo" site from the NYCC viewpoint. This will not be a public meeting as one could anticipate a very large turn-out of objectors. Rest assured, all local councillors are of one voice in opposing the proposals made during the consultation event.

Lastly, the display panels/documents on show at the consultation are now added in PDF on the parish council website under "News" (http://www.pannalandburnbridge-pc.gov.uk/News_6823.aspx).

Could those of you who requested information on the proposals made, please respond by Survey Monkey as soon as you can. This will then enable us to demonstrate to NYCC the strength of feeling against the proposals for a through route and with it the destruction of the post office. Please remember that those answers end up at Bellway and not at the council. However, they certainly do count and will be made available. If you didn't manage to attend the Bellway briefing, you might find it convenient just to put your comments into boxes 4 and 6 of the survey.

We would appreciate it if you could give us reasons why you oppose the through route concept. There are those as stated in Pannal Village Society's response to the original planning application but that was two or three years ago – things change! Just saying it isn't wanted is insufficient; logical, factual, reasoned objections are critical if we are to have any chance of combatting the plans.
